From Azariah: "Yahweh has helped" to Abednego: "The servant of Nebo" Good conversations don't begin with proclamations, but rather by meeting people right where they are

These six truths are:

- 1. Everybody is a human person. *No exceptions*.
- 2. Every human person is of inestimable worth and value, none more than another. *No exceptions.*
- 3. Everyone is deeply and passionately loved by God. *No exceptions*.
- 4. Unfortunately everyone is burdened with a terminal illness, sin. *No exceptions*.
- 5. All, as children of Adam, are tragically separated from God, but this does not diminish God's boundless love for us. But it does devastatingly hinder our relationship with Him. *All of us, no exceptions*.

- 1. Fear of the LGBT community
- 2. Lack of Biblical Understanding
- 3. Absence of Empathy
- 4. Closed-door Attitude

Five attitudes to incorporate when engaging the culture:

- 1. Keep your standards high and your grace deep. (1 Cor. 1:18-20)
- 2. Accept people without approving of their behavior. (Dan. 1:8)
- 3. Never let the tone get contentious. (Dan. 2:14)
- 4. Lead them to truth by identifying with their struggle. (Jude v. 22-23)
- 5. Paint the picture of what it looks like to come home. (Luke 15:20)

Four perceptions about God, three are incorrect:

- 1. A Locked Gate.
 - It reflects the myth that God cannot and presumably does not want to be reached.
- 2. A Pile of Luggage.
 - It perpetuates the myth that God can't possibly want someone who has so much baggage in their lives.
- 3. An Endless Ladder.
 - People in this camp assume they must change first, that they have to work for God's acceptance by proving themselves worthy or "good enough".
- 4. A Free Gift.
 - This reflects who he really is. There's nothing we have to do nothing we can do to win his favor or earn his forgiveness.

Five scriptures and model prayers we can pray for the people God has given us to influence:

- 1. Pray that the Father would draw them to Jesus.
- 2. Bind the spirit that blinds their minds.
- 3. Let loose the spirit of adoption (personal relationship with God).
- 4. Pray that believers will enter into positive relationships with the lost, and pray that we will see opportunities that come across our paths.
- 5. Release the Spirit of wisdom and revelation on them, so they may know God better.

Friend or Enemy?

A very good rule of thumb is to ask three questions in such relationships:

- 1. Does this person know I care for them?
- 2. Do they also know why I disagree with them and they with me?

3. Can we maintain an honest, caring, self-giving relationship based on these realities?

How about we trust the Holy Spirit to convict them of what He wants to convict the of. In the meantime we'll do our best to faithfully teach them the Word and love them the best we can.
