CODE OF CONDUCT

We all want the best possible experience for your camper. In order for all campers to have a great time at camp, the following guidelines must be agreed upon.

Safety - Physically safe, and emotionally safe. Avoid doing harm to yourself and others.

Obey – Listen to counselors. Follow directions.

Attitude – Campers should have a positive, compliant attitude of RESPECT. Campers should respect themselves, staff, other campers, nature, facilities and God.

Participate – Campers need to involve themselves in programmed activities.

<u>Dismissal Policy</u> – SLDC reserves the right to dismiss any camper who does not cooperate with the program's code of conduct. Here are some examples of cause for dismissal:

- 1. Running from staff members during a time of correction.
- 2. Assault or harming another camper or staff member verbally or physically.
- 3. Refusal to be involved with the program, affecting the group in a negative way.

If a camper violates the code of conduct to a degree that dismissal is warranted, the camper will be isolated and the parent will be contacted to come pick up the camper. The camper will be dismissed for the remainder of that camp day, and the next scheduled camp day for that camper will also be cancelled.

If a camper is dismissed for behavior issues, a meeting with the parent will be scheduled and an action plan will be implemented prior to the camper's return to camp.
