



We are looking forward to serving your family by providing a quality Study Camp experience for your children. As you might expect, things will need to look a bit different this year, so here are some of the strategies that we have put in place to try to reduce the spread of viruses:

Staff Training & Awareness: The safety and well-being of our campers and staff are paramount. We will train and remind our staff of good hygiene, proper safeguards, and practices to mitigate viruses, as well as their personal responsibility to our campers to help stop the spread. Signs will be posted as well to keep these new protocols in the front of our minds. Daily check ins will take place with our staff to constantly evaluate health and catch any symptoms early.

Screenings: Daily health screenings will include questions which need answered as to current health. Only registered campers should exit the car each day. Daily temperatures will be taken & recorded for all staff and campers. Anyone showing signs or symptoms of a virus will be isolated, cared for, and removed from the program until he/she can be picked up.

Space: Each group will have designated classroom space with sufficient room to spread out. Activities will be adjusted as needed, so that no one will need to touch each other. The daily guideline will be a no touching policy, to limit the spread of germs. Group sizes will be smaller and consistent. Large group times will be minimal with plenty of space to spread out.

- **a. Be Outside**. The air is fresh, and we have hundreds of acres of God's creation to explore. Fresh air, sunshine, humidity, and heat are all things that we have plenty of here in the Poconos. We believe that kids in the outdoors can stay healthier and happier.
- **b.** Scheduled Activity Times Activities will be more strictly scheduled to limit interaction between groups and allow for sanitizing equipment as needed.

<u>Masks</u>: Masks will be worn in accordance with the Universal Face Coverings Order issued by the PA department of health, which states that masks must be worn at all times indoors (including when seated in a classroom setting) and when a distance of six feet cannot be maintained outdoors. Staff and campers will wear masks in accordance with this order, unless a qualifying exemption applies.





<u>Sanitation</u> – We have implemented a rigorous cleaning and sanitation protocol to all our facilities. We will not typically share equipment between groups, but when we do need to share, we will be very purposeful in cleaning and sanitizing shared equipment.

- **c. Hand Sanitation** There are many hand sanitizing stations all over camp for campers and staff to frequently sanitize hands. Also, there will be programmed into our day times for campers to wash hands thoroughly with soap and water.
- **d.** Meeting Rooms Meeting rooms will be cleaned and sanitized between groups.
- **e. Bathrooms** Bathrooms will be cleaned and sanitized regularly, and specific bathrooms will be assigned to groups as much as possible.
- **f. Rec Equipment** Rec equipment will be sanitized between use by different groups.

<u>Security</u> – Spruce Lake & Pinebrook policy is always to be a secure place from outsiders for obvious reasons, but our security and monitoring of guests will be heightened to limit/prohibit outside visitors. We will not be taking field trips or traveling via buses. We will not be offering bus service due to lack of space on buses to keep proper distance.
